What to Expect For Dental Extractions

A dental extraction does not have to be a stressful appointment or one to fear. We have extensive experience in managing any possible anxiety, pain, infection or complications that may occur. Further, we take every precaution and all the time you need to make it a non-memorable appointment. Having the following information and following the directions outlined will help us to remove the tooth that is currently a source of current or future pain and infection.

How to Prepare For Dental Extractions

- You will need to know the medications you are taking, your medical conditions, and that these are stable and currently followed by your medical doctor.
- You should take your medicines as prescribed the day of the appointment.
- Make sure to eat regularly the day of your appointment. A hungry patient does not make for a comfortable experience.
- Be prepared with reading glasses and/or translator to read required information and procedural consent form and post-operative instructions.
- Most importantly make sure to ask any questions about the procedure, diagnosis, treatment options and future treatment that you may have.
- Also, please remember if you have been prescribed an antibiotic due to this dental infection continue it until completed as directed by the label.
